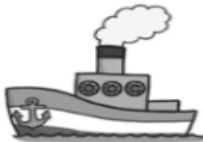

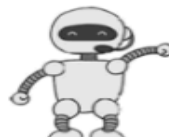

This picture is called Sunflowers and it was painted by Vincent van Gogh in 1888.
