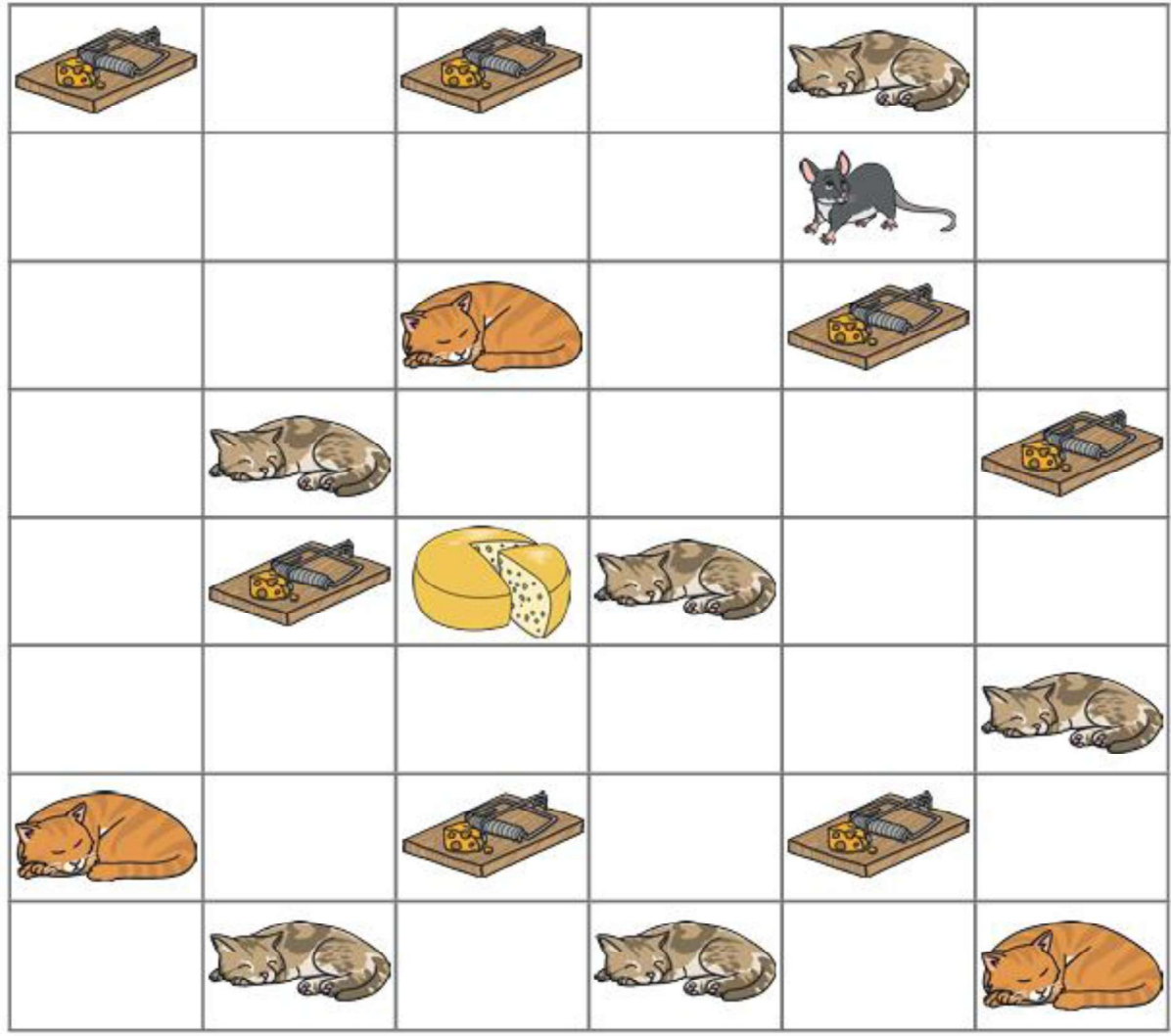

The Seasons

In the UK, there are four seasons. These are spring, summer, autumn and winter.

Spring

The weather gets drier and warmer.
Baby animals, like chicks and lambs, are born.
Some plants start to grow leaves and flowers.



Summer

The weather can be very warm and sunny.
Most trees are covered in green leaves.
Most flowers are in bloom.



Autumn

The weather usually starts to get cooler.
Sometimes, it rains a lot.
Some leaves change colour and fall from the trees.
Acorns and conkers fall to the floor.



Winter

The weather is usually much colder. Sometimes, it snows.
Some animals hibernate for the winter.
Some plants have no leaves left.



History



Bessie Coleman

(1892-1926)

Bessie Coleman was a pilot who inspired people to follow their dreams.

Early Life

- Coleman was born in Texas in the United States in 1892.
- She was one of 13 children.
- Black and White children were taught separately at her school.

Dreaming Big

Coleman's brother told her about women pilots he had seen in France when he was fighting there in the First World War. This made her want to become a pilot. The pilot schools in the US refused to train her because she was a woman and because she was Black.

Becoming a Pilot

- She learned French so she could apply to pilot school in France.
- She got her pilot's licence in France in 1921 and started learning how to do aeroplane stunts.
- Her stunt shows, flying lessons and speeches were very popular when she returned to the US.

Fighting for Fairness

- Black people were not allowed to attend some of her stunt shows.
- Sometimes Black people and White people had to use different entrance gates.
- Coleman refused to perform unless this was changed.
- She used her fame to fight for equality and inspired many people.

Fascinating Fact

Lots of people called Coleman 'Queen Bess' or 'Brave Bess'.

The Wright Brothers

Wilbur and Orville Wright were brothers who grew up in the United States. They are famous for inventing and testing the first aeroplane.



How did the Wright brothers become inventors?

- Wilbur and Orville became interested in flying because of a toy helicopter their father gave them as children.
- They were interested in birds and how they flew. This gave them the idea for the wings of their aeroplane.
- The Wright brothers also discovered how to make engines. This gave their aeroplane the power it needed to fly.

When was the first aeroplane flight?

The first test flight was in December 1903 and the plane was called the Wright Flyer. Wilbur tried to fly the plane but it did not work. They spent three days trying to fix it and waited for good weather to try again. Orville flew the plane the second time. This time it worked and the plane flew for 12 seconds.

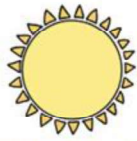
What happened after the first flight?

The Flyer II was a new aircraft that the brothers invented. Wilbur flew this in November 1904 and the flight lasted for over five minutes. They invented a plane which could fly for 39 minutes by 1905. The brothers went on to build planes for the army. They also opened up a school to teach pilots to fly.

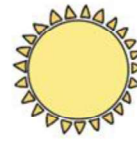
Did you know...?

- The Wright Flyer can be seen in the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum.
