- Children at Haydon Abbey are given clear and meaningful purposes for their writing, motivating them to engage confidently with a wide range of genres. - Children are immersed in rich, high-quality literature and vocabulary. They are guided to recognise effective writing features within the books they study and learn how to apply these techniques in their own work. Throughout each unit, key skills are taught through focused skills lessons, modelled and shared writing, and independent writing opportunities. - Children experience a broad range of learning opportunities through a curriculum that is ambitious, engaging, and enriched with meaningful, hands-on experiences, ensuring all pupils thrive regardless of their starting points. - Children receive high-quality teaching in the essential components of writing, including spelling, punctuation, grammar, and handwriting.	- A whole-school overview is used to map out the writing genres taught in each year group across the year. - Discussion and oral rehearsal are routinely used to support children in developing confidence, clarity, and coherence in their spoken and written work. - Children in YR–Y2 receive daily phonics lessons to build strong foundations in early writing skills. - From Y3 onwards, children take part in daily spelling lessons to develop confidence and accuracy, with a clear understanding of spelling rules and grammatical structures. - Children’s work is valued and celebrated, with a strong emphasis on high-quality presentation and handwriting, which are consistently modelled and reinforced throughout writing lessons. - A structured handwriting programme (PenPals) is used to support the progressive teaching of handwriting skills	- Children at Haydon Abbey will have developed a broad and rich vocabulary, confidently drawing on high-quality literature and shared reading experiences. - Children at Haydon Abbey will have a secure understanding of grammar and linguistic conventions, enabling them to communicate with clarity and precision. - Children will be immersed in a rich variety of books and authors, fostering a love of reading and exposure to different styles and voices. - Children are able to write clearly, accurately and coherently, adapting their language and style for a variety of contexts, purposes and audiences. - Children develop well-formed handwriting skills that allow them to write with speed, fluency and accuracy. - Children spell accurately in line with age-related expectations and use a range of strategies to attempt unfamiliar words with confidence.
